

Outpatient problem gambling services in Portland Oregon, Graduate school training clinic.


Oregon's Workforce - 2023

Gaps & Barriers in the Workforce In Oregon

- PG prevalence ~2-4% of the population
 - o 80,000 Oregonians
 - 281 PG clients for every PG counselor
- 796 client enrollments FY 2023-2024
 - Amounts to 1% of estimated prevalence
 - 3 PG clients for every PG counselor
- Barriers
 - 40% of providers clustered in Metro area
 - Low caseloads lead to multiple hats
 - Low priority compared to other programs



A Look At Lewis & Clark PGS



- Increase in referrals in Multnomah County (Portland Metro) after height of Pandemic
 - L&C PGS, going from 1-2 screening calls per week to 1-2 per day
- Went from offering an intake next day to a 3-4 week waitlist
- L&C is run by interns, only 3 shifts/week, balancing client care and clinical development
- Need for more clinical support to lower wait times

Development of the Certification Observation & Externship Program



- For those pursuing certification within an agency with low PG enrollments
- Those wanting to sharpen their clinical skills
- Those who want to **connect** with a larger PG provider community for support
- To assist L&C with seeing clients and shortening client wait times

Extern Opportunities



- Join the Lewis & Clark PG team!
- At least 2 clients per week
- Up to 150 client hours
- LOTS of supervision & consultation!
- Connect with other providers pursing their
 CGAC
- Receive stipend every 50 direct client hours

Live Observation



- Consult with the counselor prior
- Observe live sessions
- Consult and provide feedback during group supervision
- Access to recorded sessions
- Supervisor has ability to watch live sessions via zoom
 - Provide real time feedback in sessions to externs

Funding the Program

- OHA budget for Workforce Development
- Annual amount NTE \$45,000
- Monthly costs:
 - Extern (for each up to 2): \$1350
 - Observer Participant: \$912
 - Overhead: \$200
- Agency "sponsorship" or OHA provided stipend of \$2,000 for every 50 client hours



Program Requirements

- Must currently be working at one of the 50 agencies that are state-contracted to provide PG services
- Hold a current counseling certification (SUD, MH)
- CGAC-R
- Completed educational courses for CGACI
- Commit to 1, 6 hour shift per week



Review of the first year

- Lisa CGAC-R (tested yesterday!)
- 2 clients from February to May
- 20 client hours
- 26 hours of individual and group supervision
- Graduated 1 client successfully
- Transferred 1 client successfully to new CEOP extern
