HARM REDUCTION AND GAMBLING (EARLY DAYS)

- “Reno model”: Based on the premise that consumers are ultimately responsible for their own behavior (Blaszczynski et al. 2004).
 - 1) Consumers need be presented with accurate information to make informed choices
 - 2) When problems arise, people should have access to treatment
- Criticisms
 - Little discussion of responsibility for providers (there is some though)
 - Providing accurate information on an activity that is designed to make you misjudge outcomes presents problems
 - Treatment is costly and treatment seeking is low



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HARM PREVENTION AND REDUCTION STRATEGIES

- Self-exclusion: Often burdensome for help-seeker
- In game messages: “Take a break” messages, time or money based
- Personalized feedback: Compare your behavior to the average (“normative”), addressing erroneous beliefs
- Remove large bill accepters: User needs to make the decision to reload more often
- Lower maximum bets: Potential to increase habituation
- Removal ATM/credit: Increases need to for planning
- Precommitment/spending limits: Budgeting and time limits (mostly outside US)



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HARM REDUCTION AND ONLINE GAMBLING

- While some strategies listed can work across platforms, many are made with in person gambling as the ideal.
- Online presents challenges (Marrioneau et al. 2023)
 - Difficulties in regulation of operators
 - High sophistication in targeting customers
 - High rate of play
 - Difficulties restricting access (age, intoxication, region)
 - Challenges in targeting intervention
 - Patrons tend to think that existing tools are not relevant to them

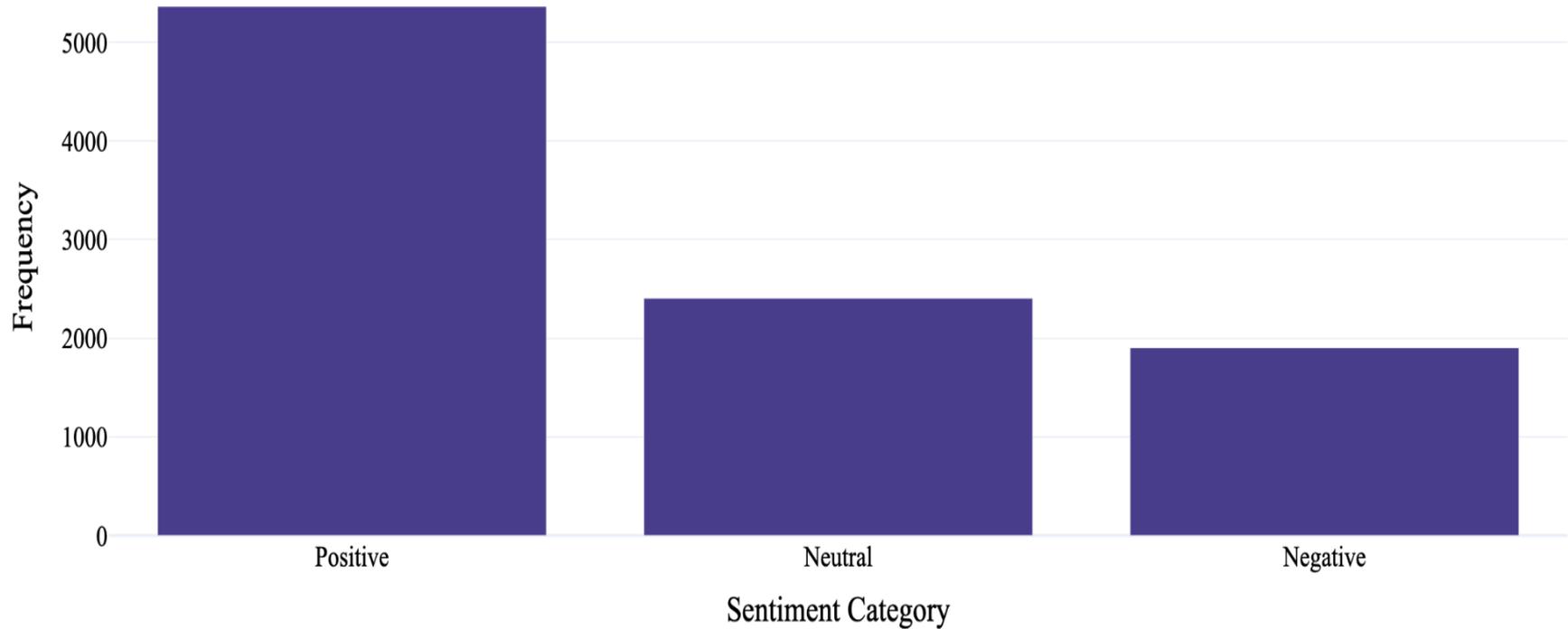


WHAT DO PEOPLE GAMBLING ONLINE WANT?

- What are people gambling online getting out of their participation and what are the harms they want to avoid?
- Reddit forum (subreddit) r/onlinegambling
 - 1141 posts and 11668 comments between Augst 5, 2015 and October 30, 2023
- Natural Language Processing (VADER) to help sort data and identify patterns
- Sentiment analysis to sort positive, neutral and negative posts

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DESIRES AND HARMS

- The goal: Most users were interested in long-term, sustained play
 - Wins were celebrated but profit orientation was considered unrealistic or untruthful
 - Discussions frequently centered on giving new users advice
- Harm: “Scam” providers
 - A lot of discussion on sites to avoid and stories of unpaid winnings
- Harm: Predatory practices
 - Engaging with promotions and bonuses were discouraged
- Harm: Enforcement
 - Shared strategies on avoiding detection when gambling across digital borders



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POTENTIAL PROBLEMS FOR COMMUNITY

- Overrepresentation of winnings
 - Frequent discussions of winning can make users overestimate chances of winning
- Repeating erroneous beliefs about gambling
 - Discussions of “hot hand” fallacy, gamblers’ fallacy (“you’re due to win!”)
- Encouraging perseverance
 - “keep at it”, “don’t give up!”
- Stigmatizing language surrounding mental health
 - Identifying self or others as “degenerate”, “psycho” used to describe someone not in control of their gambling



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ECHOES OF SUBSTANCE USE COMMUNITIES

- Howard Becker: Becoming a Marijuana User
 - Social interaction is a necessary part of using cannabis
 - Technique, interpretation of sensation, how to avoid detection are all learned informally and reflect the needs of the community members
- Opioid use community members
 - Informal “shooting galleries”, locating good/safe supply, avoid police
 - Forms to limit risk but maintain participation



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TAKEAWAYS

- Aspects of gambling pose unique challenges in harm reduction and prevention
 - Online delivery even more so
 - Still common themes with SUDs
- Gambling harm a topic is underrepresented in Social Work
 - A big problem give the dramatic expansion in gambling availability
- Globally, harm reduction and prevention is moving towards constraints on the gambling providers
 - Still largely focused on consumer responsibility in the US



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WHAT DOES A GOOD FRAMEWORK LOOK LIKE?

- Finland government monopoly
 - Explicit federal strategy for addressing gambling harm
 - Maximum loss limits €500 a day and €2,000 a month
- Netherlands
 - Duty of care for operators
 - Centralized exclusion registry
 - Required anonymized data sharing
- Canada (Ontario)
 - Playsmart centers: Onsite staff giving advice on lower risk playing and referral for help seekers
